I can't be the only one sitting here wondering where 2024 went?! It seems like each year goes by faster and faster! What a great

times, revamped some internal policies, and so much more!

A few financial statistics on how



year it was: we celebrated our 60th Anniversary, brought on some great new team members, broke our safety record, made substantial progress on a few innovative products, improved efficiency processes throughout the building, reduced our lead

our year ended up:

- Sales in 2024 were \$19.84M, which is about \$1M (4.72%) less than 2023.
  - Exports played a huge role in that decrease.
     Last year we shipped about

28.1% of our total sales to export customers, whereas 2024 was only about 22.8%. This equates to about a \$1.3M decrease.

- · Sales by product group:
  - ► Hand cup: \$9.1M or 45%
  - ► Equipment: \$5.7M or 29%
  - ► Parts: \$3.3M or 17%
  - Other products: \$1M or 5%
  - Aegis: \$831k or 4%
- We made a few substantial equipment purchases in 2024:

AmTrav, the company we buy most of our airline tickets from, provided me with an excellent information sheet on the best times and methods for traveling to avoid flight delays and cancellations during the winter.
